NOISE

Examples: (No noise producing activity should occur after 1:30 a.m ;
Noise in suite common area is to be kept at a minimum level)

GUESTS

Examples: (Guests of the opposite gender may not use the suite bath-
room; Guests of the opposite gender are permitted in suite up until 1
a.m. ; No overnight guests can sleep in suite common area)

CLEANING

Examples: (Garbage can in suite room will be cleaned by residents of
suite on a daily basis [based on predetermined schedule]; Bathroom
sink / vanity area is to be left cleared at all times)

COMMUNICATION

Examples: (No rude behavior will be permitted [e.g. slamming doors, cursing and other derogatory remarks, talking behind others' back, etc.]; Communication will occur with one another when a violation occurs.

BORROWING

How do you feel about sharing things, such as clothes, TV, stereo, tapes/CDs, or car? Be specific if only certain items are ok.

STUDYING

When do you like to study? How? Where? With who?

All suitemates (and guests) must abide by the Student Conduct Code and Terms of Occupancy. This contract is open to additions (only under the approval of all suitemates).
